
Draft Resolution #2017-09

WHEREAS, this would bring National Convention Quorum in line with Article I, Section 2 of the By-Laws; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the following verbiage in quotation marks shall replace the verbiage found currently in the National Constitution, Article X, Section 5. "One (1) more than half of those registered and eligible to vote shall constitute a quorum, as long as there are 4 Sons of AMVETS Elected Officers on that level Present."

What is Crohn's Disease?

- Crohn's Disease is an Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD). It is a chronic inflammatory condition of the gastrointestinal tract. Crohn's Disease affects any part of the gastrointestinal (GI) tract. It commonly affects the end of the small bowel and the beginning of the colon.
- No one knows what causes Crohn's Disease and there is not cure.

What is Ulcerative Colitis?

• Ulcerative Colitis (UC) is a chronic inflammatory condition of the colon (also called the large intestine). There is no cure and no one knows what causes UC.

Awareness

- Inflammatory Bowel Diseases have been included in the Department of Defense (DOD) Peer-Reviewed Medical Research Program since FY08. IBD is associated with service in the Persian Gulf and the prevalence of IBD is increasing among veterans.
- Congressional Crohn's and Colitis Caucus is a bi-partisan group of members of congress that work together to raise awareness of inflammatory Bowel Diseases (IBD), support medical research, and protect patient access to care. The Caucus is led in the House of Representatives Ander Crenshaw (R-FL) and Nita Lowey (D-NY).

Commanders, 2nd Vice Commanders,

Gentlemen, it is the time of year again to catch up with our Project Reporting, making sure that all reports are entered in a timely manner; all reports need to be entered by June 30th, 2017. On the whole, we have had a good showing this past year and currently stand at \$6,818,296.13 in reporting this is \$1,232,980.89 in advance of last year at this time. However, we can do better; there are a large number of Squadrons yet to report or bring their reporting up to date and indeed, some Departments that are behind in reporting. I implore you 2nd Vice Commanders and Commanders to crack the whip, shake the tree and see what falls out, call around and go for one last push before the end of the reporting year. We all do Projects let's get them reported and help out our Veterans.

After some research into the hourly reporting rate we find that last May the amount clamed advanced by \$1.09 and that there will be a further adjustment at the end of May this year. To accomplish this adjustment, it is my intention to adjust the hourly amounts claimed by Departments and Squadrons, so Department and Squadron 2nd Vice Commanders look out for this adjustment. The online hourly rate will be adjusted directly and all future reports will be entered with the corrected amount.

New Projects: PNC Briggs Craft Kit Project assisted by HHV (Help Healing Veterans) is still running and Craft Kits are still available, and will be for the foreseeable future, these Craft Kits come at absolutely no cost to the Squadron or Department. This past year we have done so well disseminating Craft Kits from HHV that the "Sons of AMVETS" have been named "Partner of the Year" by HHV; since the projects inception the SOA have put 15,600 plus Craft Kits into the hands of Veterans. This said, the Kits are still available, the Project is a "NO BRAINER" at no cost to the Squadron or Department, you claim \$26 per Kit plus miles and hours do the math it really is that simple. The one question I tend to get is "were do we get the Veterans from to give the Kits to?" answer, start by holding a Craft Kit day at your Post it's full of Veterans, invite other Veterans to attend (Legion, VFW etc.) you can also turn it into a membership recruiting day, this works. All Squadrons and Departments should be all over this, go to the link on the right hand side of our web page and sign up, remember "no cost and you claim".

Also Gentlemen, remember Commander Serpis's Project "Crones and Colitis Foundation of America" please support by buying raffle tickets or donating to the cause and don't forget to enter a project report.

I would like to take time to thank one and all for the support you have given me this past year as your 2nd Vice Commander. You have all done a great job this year by pushing the National Department and yourselves to new stellar and laudatory heights; again my thanks for supporting me and I hope you all will continue to in the future.

Do not forget all this year's reports need to be in by June 30th, 2017. Do not stop reporting, please continue, we are doing well but can always do better.
