Today, Tanya Bradsher was confirmed by the Senate as the <u>first female deputy secretary of the Department of Veterans Affairs</u> after a 50-46 vote. She has served as the chief of staff to VA Secretary Denis McDonough since March 2021. Despite the contentious leadup to her confirmation, she is expected to be sworn into her new post within the next few days.

The 9/11 terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center in New York and the Pentagon in Washington, DC took place 22 years ago yesterday. The official death toll has been placed at almost 3 thousand people, including those who crashed into a field in Pennsylvania. First Lady Jill Biden laid a wreath at the Pentagon's remembrance ceremony yesterday morning, hosted by Secretary of Defense Lloyd Austin. President Joe Biden attended a commemoration event in Anchorage, Alaska upon his return from the G20 summit.

A <u>6.8 magnitude earthquake</u> struck Morocco on Friday evening, killing 2.5 thousand people and leaving just as many injured. It was the strongest earthquake recorded in the country in over a century, and the search for survivors continues. For information on how you can help, click <u>here</u>.

In a <u>letter to airmen</u> late last week, Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. Charles Q. Brown warned that the Chinese military is "targeting and recruiting U.S. and NATO-training military talent," including veterans. Several schemes have been reported where China has sought the expertise of serving and former American pilots to train the country's military personnel. Allies have also been asked to caution their active duty and veteran populations against such recruitment efforts.

The Office of the Inspector General (OIG) for the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has issued an advisory following its investigation into allegations that the VA did not adequately oversee <u>electronic health record modernization</u> (EHRM) progress reports from its vendor. The advisory states that while these allegations were not substantiated, the VA lacked timelines for when Cerner, the contractor, was required to submit corrections to insufficient progress reports. OIG has asked the VA to detail the actions it plans to take to improve the deliverable review process for future contracts.

As the House returns from recess today, an <u>ugly fight with the Senate</u> is shaping up over the budget. Congress has a September 30 deadline for passing crucial funding bills, and Senators are urging their counterparts in the House to work in a more bipartisan manner to avoid a potential government shutdown. Still, hard-right Republicans are threatening to hold their line indefinitely.

The VA released a <u>new advertisement campaign</u> ahead of National Suicide Prevention Week. Part of the "Don't Wait. Reach Out." campaign, these ads are meant to help veterans who are hesitant
